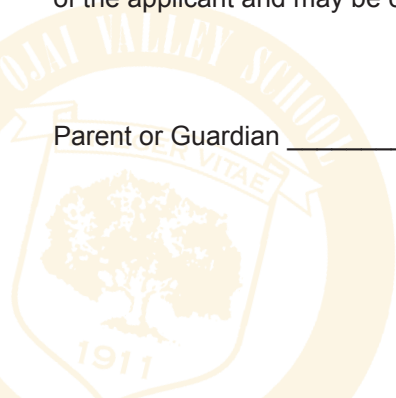

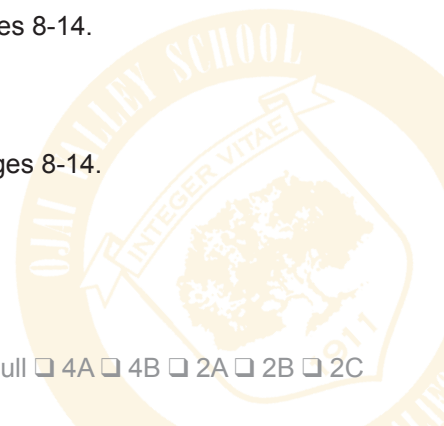
English Language Study Tour (ELST): This two-week program is for resident campers only, ages 8-14.

SECTION 1

If you are choosing one of the following courses or programs, check only that box and make no further selections.

ESL-ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE (Grades 3-8)

This course offers less than 18 hours of class time per week and is designed for campers who want to improve their English-language proficiency in reading, writing, and grammar while interacting with American peers during afternoon and evening activities. Field trips to museums and other local destinations are included. Additional weeks of ESL are available during the ELST program, June 20 – July 3.

CIT PROGRAM (Applicants must have previous OVS camp experience)

This counselor-in-training program is designed for former OVS campers, ages 14 -15, who want to develop leadership skills and help organize camp activities. CIT students work closely with camp counselors and serve as leaders to younger campers. Prior approval of camp director Eleanora Burright is required to enter this program.

ARE YOU READY FOR 3RD GRADE? (Grade 3)

This class previews third grade curriculum and focuses on reading, writing, math and science skills in a nurturing and fun way.

SECTION 2

Please choose from the following course offerings. Number your first FIVE CHOICES in order of preference. Campers will be assigned four classes. Courses are subject to minimum enrollment and space availability. Every effort will be made to place you in your top choices. Campers who completed Section 1 or are applying to Performing Arts Camp, Equestrian Camp, Sports Camp, or the English Language Study Tour, do not need to complete this section.

— **STUDY SKILLS WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

This workshop focuses on test-taking secrets, organizational skills and time management. It is designed to sharpen camper study habits.

— **MATH WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

This class will help develop basic mathematical skills with a creative and individualized approach to learning.

— **SHOW ME THE MONEY! (Grades 4-8)**

This class introduces campers to basic financial planning and responsibility, including keeping a checking account and setting a budget.

— **READING WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

This class offers instruction in vocabulary recognition, phonics and reading comprehension.

— **BOOK CLUB (Grades 4-8)**

Each session focuses on reading one short novel or portion of a novel. Collaborative group reading and analysis on plot, theme, and characters will be used.

— **MUSIC WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

This class explores musical genres and offers a hands-on introduction to music-making, use of voice and discovering your inner rhythms.

— **GOING GREEN (Grades 4-8)**

Biology, physics, and chemistry are incorporated to introduce campers to environmental awareness. Campers learn about endangered species, rainforests, conservation, recycling, and alternative energy sources.

— **CREATIVE WRITERS WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

Descriptive writing techniques are encouraged through journaling, creating poetry, writing short stories and essays.

— **WRITING WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)**

This class focuses on the elements of word choice, vocabulary, and sentence structure, punctuation, paragraphing, and organizing an essay.

COURSE SELECTIONS (CONTINUED)

— COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (Grades 4-8)

Designed to familiarize campers with the computer as a fun and educational tool, this class teaches basic computing concepts, Internet research skills, and gives an introduction to several productivity applications. The course is taught in a project based curriculum focusing on the understanding of shared conventions and the development of proficiency with the Microsoft Office Suite.

— ART WORKSHOP (Grades 4-8)

Create art through a variety of techniques such as drawing, sketching, and mixed media. Projects encourage artistic expression and creativity.

— ANIMAL ADVOCACY (Grades 4-8) *New!*

This project-based class will introduce campers to the concept of animal advocacy and provide them an opportunity to create an action plan to help animals in need. As part of this class, campers will conduct research, participate in group activities and field trips, and learn about species protection.

— MULTI-MEDIA DESIGN (Grades 6-8)

Campers work to design and develop their own web sites and gain proficiency with graphic design tools. Clean coding and usable page design will be the focus of this project-based course. Prerequisite- Strong proficiency with basic computing concepts and productivity applications.

— PREVIEW TO HIGH SCHOOL MATH WORKSHOP (Grades 7-8)

This course introduces concepts and skills associated with pre-algebra, algebra I and beginning geometry. Group and individual instruction is provided depending upon skill level. Campers are assessed to identify individual strengths and areas of concern.

— JOURNALISM WORKSHOP (Grades 7-8)

This course encourages self-expression in writing through a variety of media. Campers become reporters, photographers and writers with a final production of a camp newsletter at the end of each session.

— SSAT WORKSHOP (Grades 7-8)

This six-week class prepares campers for the reading, verbal, and quantitative sections of the SSAT, required for admission to most college-preparatory high schools. General study skills will also be covered.
