It has been a great week of in-person learning! It is so wonderful to see students engaging with teachers and peers in the classroom and around campus. Visiting classrooms, I have seen teachers working hard to juggle in-person and virtual students, but they are getting it done. Some sense of normalcy has, finally, returned to campus and this includes the return to sports and outdoor education.

Cross country, girls volleyball, boys soccer, and equestrian are now underway following CIF guidelines and COVID protocols. While team sports won't begin competition until January, students and coaches are eager to get down to business to prepare for the upcoming seasons. Additionally, outdoor education day trips have begun on the Upper Campus. Just this past Wednesday a group of eight students and two faculty leaders went to the Sespe Wilderness to explore White Rocks. The trip was the first of several we have planned that will focus on hiking, rock climbing, mountain biking, and ocean activities. Additionally, today we rolled out new Learning Exploring Activities and Pursuits (LEAP) offerings that will begin next week. All students will participate and offerings include robotics, CPR-first aid, winter musical, college counseling, Gay-Straight Alliance (GSA), yearbook, skateboarding, sports training, and more. Students can propose other ideas as well.

Ojai Valley School's co-curricular programs are core to the student experience. Being able to offer sports, equestrian, outdoor education, in addition to academic classes and elective offerings, allows our high school students to pursue activities that are important to their health and well-being — perhaps more than ever given the emotional strain of COVID and months spent indoors.

Please continue to follow the health protocols, both at home and on campus, to keep our community safe. Wear masks, keep at least 6 feet of social distance, regularly wash hands, and stay home if you do not feel well. 

## **Planning for Thanksgiving Break**

To avoid potential virus exposure, we are advising families to carefully consider their upcoming Thanksgiving Break plans.
